Welcome given by Laurie at 4:32pm. Approval of April meeting minutes approved with minor corrections. Motion made by Robert Kibler to approve minutes and seconded by Niki Roed. Minutes approved with corrections.

Rebecca Ringham had a couple of items brought for discussion.

- The graduation application could begin in the Registrar's office electronically versus paper.
 - o Use an online process for graduation apps instead of paper
 - o Start/Implement in Spring 2019
 - The new process would help with graduation apps that get stuck or lost on advisors' desks or in departments.
 - Please reach out to advisors, departments, and faculty to see get feedback and questions before this goes live.
- Discussion about charging for late graduation apps. Mayville charges \$25 for late graduation applications. MiSU could also start charging a fee.
- Universal requirements A committee could be created to address issues with university requirements. Pros and cons were discussed as well as using existing committees to address these issues.

Erik Kana discussed the Orientation Advisory Taskforce (OAT) and Academic Advising Council meetings.

- OAT met Friday, April 27 and discussed:
 - o Not all colleges were represented, not enough faculty reps
 - o Disparity between advising loads and compensation issues
 - o Survey coming out Monday, April 30 to all advisors

Return-to-Learn – guidelines of concussion management (see attached document)

- Foundation of this Return-to-Learn policy includes
 - o Cognitive and physical rest following concussion
 - o A stepwise program that fits the needs of each individual
 - o Recommendations made within the context of the multi-disciplinary team

o Communication between the student, course instructor and medical personnel regarding the student's condition and updates progress.
