## Meeting Minutes

Approve UCC meeting minutes from 11/15/2021, motion made by Lori Willoughby and seconded by Mary Huston. Minutes approved as written.

Melissa Cantone and Rebecca Ringham: Schedule, weird hours, Hartnett renovation, 8-week courses and alignment with 16-week courses

- Melissa noted that there are a couple of courses with hours of 9-11:50am and 1-3:50pm two days a week. The courses cause issues with classrooms as they block classrooms for three hours two times a week. 11am is a prime time that lots of faculty would like.
- This will be more problematic with Harnett Hall (HHall) renovations beginning.
- Could some classes run synchronously during HHall renovation?
- Laurie will send a summary of classes.
- Jessica Smestad noted that Honors has a room that can be used for classes.
- The library has study rooms for offices during the HHall renovation.

8-week course alignment

- There is no break between eight-week sessions
- Grades for 8-week courses were due Tuesday, December 14, 2021
- Per Rebecca, there can be no instructional days during finals week.

Final exams – Really?!

- Issues arose of holds going on so close to registration.
  - Students have met with their advisor, and all is good, but when they go to register, holds had been added.
  - Holds were for Title IX and immunization records.
  - Kevin Harmon will talk with Student Health and make sure holds are added earlier (add them October 1 for spring registration and March 1 for fall and summer registration).
  - Someone noted that students do not always get what they want and may have to stick around for one final.
  - Laurie noted the same is true for faculty and they should have a final exam or final activity or assignment scheduled during finals week.

General Education update

- Ad Hoc committee will be presenting at Faculty Senate on December 16, 2021.
- Joseph Jastrzembski stated they are still working.
- Much discussion was held about having several models for the Gen Ed. Per Rebecca each gen ed would need to be assigned to the degree. If a student This must be in campus connection.

Budget presentations, SPBC (Strategic Planning and Budget Council), state funding in future, low enrolled classes

- SPBC is meeting several times throughout the week for a total of about 15 hours.
- Brent has the state funding model out to about 2024; as 2024 is the academic year that MiSU gets hit with about a \$1 ML decrease from the state funding model.
- 20-plus positions were requested across campus during budget presentations.
