Faculty Who Won't Leave the Building During Fire Drills- Cheryl Nilsen

There are issues of faculty that refuse to leave the building during fire drills, this is for safety purposes. Deans are asked to speak with chairs about this. It was also suggested that Gary Orluck be invited to chairs or department meetings to discuss this issue and where to go when exiting the building, sheltering for tornado drills, etc.

Fall 2015 Fourth Week Numbers – Rebecca Porter and Cari Olson

Projected enrollment for fall 2015 was within 17 students and had MSU down 1.8%.

Retention rates for our full-time, first time cohort from the 13/14 academic year are as follows: 316 fall14 / 237 fall15, 75.24% retained. This is the highest retention rate recorded for MSU. The part-time cohort that year is at 40% retained (25 fall14 / 10 fall15) but it this is a much smaller cohort. Please see attached documentation
